### OPTIONAL FCA HUDDLE LESSON:

#### STAYING CONNECTED!

*For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others.” -Romans 12:4-5*

#### WELCOME

We will start our time together by learning the key idea that we are called to be in a growing relationship with Jesus Christ and to “Stay Connected” to His church.

#### WARM-UP

What is the benefit you get by gathering together in the FCA Huddle?

How about other teams/organizations you are a part of?

After a season of sports together what is it like not to gather anymore?

When we live life alone isolated from the body of Christ we risk **Spiritual Weakness and Discouragement, Lack of Growth and Accountability, Increased Vulnerability to Spiritual Attacks, Loss of Unity and Boldness, and Spiritual Withering and Loss of Purpose.**

#### WORKOUT

The bible talks about being part of the body of Christ and Unity?

The Bible extensively uses the metaphor of the **Body of Christ** to emphasize that believers are **intrinsically connected** to one another and cannot function independently.

Key passages like **1 Corinthians 12** and **Ephesians 4** describe the church as a single organism where every member is **interdependent**, with specific gifts suited for the common good.

1 Cor 12:12-14 For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. <sup>13</sup> For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all

been made to drink <sup>[a]</sup>into one Spirit. <sup>14</sup> For in fact the body is not one member but many.

Eph 4:1-5 I, therefore, the prisoner <sup>[a]</sup>of the Lord, <sup>[b]</sup>beseech you to walk worthy of the calling with which you were called, <sup>2</sup> with all lowliness and gentleness, with longsuffering, bearing with one another in love, <sup>3</sup> endeavoring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace. <sup>4</sup> *There is* one body and one Spirit, just as you were called in one hope of your calling; <sup>5</sup> one Lord, one faith, one baptism; <sup>6</sup> one God and Father of all, who *is* above all, and through all, and in <sup>[c]</sup>you all.

### WRAP-UP

Scripture argues that **isolation is contrary to God's design**, citing that if one part suffers, all parts suffer, and if one is honored, all rejoice (**1 Corinthians 12:26**).

1 Cor 12:26 And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with *it*; or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with *it*.

This unity is maintained through **love, forgiveness, and shared purpose**, as seen in **Colossians 3:13-14** and **Hebrews 10:24-25**, which urge believers not to forsake assembling together.

Col 3:13-14 bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also *must do*. <sup>14</sup> But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection.

Therefore, the Bible presents staying connected to the local church as **essential** for spiritual growth, the fulfillment of God's plan, and the **manifestation of Christ's love** to the world.

**Interdependence:** No member is separate; each contributes to the health and growth of the whole body.

**Call to belonging:** It emphasizes that we are “members one of another,” fostering a sense of shared purpose and mutual care.

The Bible calls believers to “stay connected” to the Body of Christ. This means attending worship, engaging in prayer and fellowship, and participating in the church’s mission. Disconnection is not just a personal choice—it is a spiritual risk that affects both the individual and the whole Body
